Like New Courbette Magic Close Contact 17.5 inch English saddle. Color is chestnut brown. Not even a year old and its condition is perfect. I want a different saddle for my horse as my interests have changed. The tree is a flex tree that will fit a wide range of wither widths - anywhere from regular to wide. This will not fit a narrow or high withered horse unless you have supplemental pads to correct the saddle fit (that is how I've been using it, and with the proper padding the saddle fits fine and leaves a perfect sweat mark on my horse's back). The Magic line from Courbette is specially treated top end leather that is pretty much waterproof and requires no special oiling or cleaning.

Courbette saddle cover, Courbette matching stirrup leathers, stirrup irons, leather chaffless girth size 48 (not sure what size the girth is, a and keyhole/lollipop pad with cover are sold with it. I paid over \$800 for everything new not even a year ago.
